- Since we graduated the first master’s degree student in 2003, UMD School of Architecture, Planning, and Preservation has graduated over 90 MHP students.
- The UMD historic preservation program was created by an interdisciplinary group including history, architecture, planning, anthropology, and American studies to serve the field’s need for generalists to mediate between specialists such as conservators, designers, and historians. Coursework balances academic research with professional training in documentation, policy, and interpretation to prepare students to participate in the many aspects of contemporary preservation practice.
- Reflecting that diverse approach, UMD alumni work in a variety of fields, including government at all levels, cultural resources management and architecture firms, museums, historic sites, and major universities, as well as other related non-profits.
- Nearly a third of our master’s graduates are working in government jobs ranging from the National Park Service, the Georgia State Department of Transportation, and Peerless Rockville.
- Another third of our master’s graduates are working for architecture, engineering, or CRM firms.
- Many graduates are working for private non-profit groups that specialize in local preservation and environmental conservation issues.
- UMD students are working in preservation jobs across the country and internationally as well.
