RDEV 350 Class at the Aster College Park!

Professor Marcus Ervin's RDEV 350 class recently toured the Aster College Park, a newly constructed development located at the former site of Plato's Diner and the Quality Inn and Suites along Baltimore Ave. The project is a joint venture between Bozzuto Development, Terrapin Development Company (TDC), Willard Retail and JP Morgan. The complex features 393 apartment units and 60,000 sq. ft. of retail anchored by Trader Joe's and Crunch Fitness. In addition, the community will feature a variety of retail options including PNC Bank, Fresh Green Salad, Inspire Nails, Bandit Taco, Roots Natural Kitchen, All Care, The Joint Chiropractic and Arepa Zone. During the tour, students learned about the role of a property manager to ensure a property's success. Led by Corinne Goldsmith '07, General Manager, Bozzuto, students also gained knowledge regarding market demographics, property management and mixed-use/urban development.

SoRED & Alumni Happy Hour


