Summary Description:

The Pruden Farm quarter is a frame duplex, one story with a garret, with a side-gable roof and horizontal siding, supported by a brick foundation (@28'11" by 16'4" in dimension). Two doorways on the west-facing façade provide access to the first-floor rooms. A window positioned off-center between the doorways provides light to the larger south room. There is a single window in each end wall; one window is located in the east wall roughly opposite the doorway to the room to the north. A substantial brick-lined cellar is located below the floor in the south room. Each of the rooms is heated by substantial fireplaces served by a brick central chimney; although the fire boxes remain the chimney stack is largely dismantled. Windows in each gable light the garret, but there is no evidence for a stair, or for it having been floored. A doorway has been cut into the partition west of the fireplaces to provide direct access between the two first floor rooms. The doors and windows of this structure have little framing with no headers, which seems to be the norm in this area. The sills have been replaced with modern dimensional lumber and wire nails. The structure is located 128 feet from the NE corner of the main house, at 270°. Both sections of the main house have 3:1 bond in the chimneys and the raised basement.


