Persisting Social Vulnerability, Stormwater Infrastructure, and Planning for Flooding and Resilience in Washington, D.C.

Committee Chair: Dr. Marccus D. Hendricks

Park's dissertation explores the intricate relationship between stormwater infrastructure, social vulnerability and urban flood management in Washington, D.C. Through three detailed studies, it investigates the distribution of stormwater resources across the city, revealing both temporal and spatial disparities that correlate with social vulnerability. Utilizing spatio-temporal analysis and an Environmental Justice (EJ) framework, the research assesses the equitable allocation of these resources and the efficacy of existing flood management strategies. The findings highlight substantial inequities in infrastructure distribution, persistent social vulnerabilities and potential exacerbations of these issues within current urban planning efforts. Park's work contributes to the ongoing discourse on fostering more equitable and resilient urban planning, with a strong emphasis on equity considerations.

Alex Donahue

Do Interior Privately Owned Public Spaces Foster Urban Public Life? A Comparative Study of Four NYC Public Space Typologies

Committee Chair: Madlen Simon, AIA

The arrangement of privately owned space mandated for public use provides a unique dilemma: How can a space provide ideal benefits to the public while recognizing the individual rights associated with a privately owned space?

Using architectural, signage and archival analysis and observation of behaviors in privately owned public spaces in New York City, Donahue compared Interior Privately Owned Public Spaces (IPOPS) with three other space typologies to discover how successfully the physical characteristics of IPOPS foster urban public life, focusing on aspects of (a) sociability; (b) inclusion; (c) wayfinding; (d) ownership; (e) well-being; and (f) community. Donahue's research illustrates that in the sample of spaces studied, and compared with other spatial typologies, IPOPS do not offer the full benefit of public space as outlined in the agreements made with the city of New York.

Larry Reich Award: Larry Reich was Baltimore City Department of Planning director from 1965 to 1990 and was a central figure in the city's downtown renaissance, a proponent of community-based planning and neighborhood initiatives, and an opponent of proposed highways that would have obliterated some of Baltimore's most historic neighborhoods. The Larry Reich Award is given annually to a M.C.P.. student who has shown initiative and leadership in an area of urban revitalization or economic development.
