

Chester County Boroughs: A cohort-based approach to lead service line inventory completion

COMMUNITY NEEDS

Four small boroughs in Chester County, Pennsylvania – Atglen, Avondale, Oxford and West Grove – were referred to the Region 3 WaterTA Program for assistance completing lead service line (LSL) inventories and replacement.

These neighboring boroughs had a similar set of needs, including resolving remaining unknown service lines, submitting inventories to the state, communicating effectively with residents about the LSL inventory and replacement process, and securing affordable financing and funding for any necessary service line replacement work.

PROJECT SUMMARY

Recognizing an opportunity for peer-sharing among these neighboring communities, the WaterTA team convened the four boroughs in a series of meetings over the course of two years. During these facilitated conversations, the boroughs learned about LSL regulatory requirements, shared strategies for completing inventories, and received guidance on available financing options for line replacement. The cohort also developed customer outreach materials including letters and surveys, with support from the WaterTA team.

The WaterTA team brought in additional partners to further support the cohort's progress, including Pennsylvania DEP (guidance on legal requirements) and Chester County Water Resources Authority (technical support for customer-led service line inventory collection). With the support from the Environmental Innovation Policy Center (EPIC), the local nonprofit Garage Youth and Community Center assisted Avondale by designing communication materials in English and Spanish, leading a town hall meeting in Spanish, conducting customer outreach including via door-knocking, and filling out the community's lead service line inventory.

KEY OUTCOMES

- **New partnerships** between neighboring boroughs to support ongoing progress
- **Submission of lead service line inventories** in all four boroughs and progress toward resolving unknown service lines
- Avondale (via separate support from WaterTA team): **Submission and receipt of US Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Development Block Grant** to conduct camera testing of wastewater system in order to identify leakages and prioritize repairs
