



MASTER OF COMMUNITY PLANNING CURRICULUM

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The Urban Studies and Planning (URSP) program offers the Master of Community Planning (MCP) degree, which builds students' capacity to work in a range of organizational settings across the diverse field of planning. Across our coursework, we integrate perspectives from history, social science, design, and other allied fields of study and practice. We train students to be proficient in the use and application of knowledge and skills in a variety of professional settings. We challenge students to understand, internalize, and enact principles of justice and equity for underrepresented and vulnerable groups and communities through ethical practice.

The MCP is a 48-credit professional degree program comprised of eight required core courses (24 credits); a capstone consisting of a required 6-credit community planning studio class and an internship (taken for 3 credits or no credits); and six elective courses (18 credits). If the internship is taken for no credit, the student must take an additional elective course to reach the 48 hours of required credits. Nine (9) elective credits must be in an area of specialization. A specialization is comprised of a set of related courses, defined in consultation with the faculty mentor, which cover a domain of specialized planning knowledge. With the approval of their faculty mentor, students may take courses outside of URSP to meet the requirements of a specialization. Students may choose from one of the following specializations or define a custom specialization in consultation with the faculty mentor.

- Housing and Community Development
- Economic Development
- Environmental Planning
- Transportation Planning

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COURSE SCHEDULING

COURSES OUTSIDE THE PROGRAM

With the approval of their faculty mentor, students can take courses outside of the URSP program to meet specialization and elective requirements. The graduate catalog provides a list of all graduate courses offered at UMD (http://apps.gradschool.umd.edu/catalog/registration_policies.htm).

UMD is a partner with the local higher education consortium. The Consortium of Universities of the Washington Metropolitan Area includes American University, Catholic University, Gallaudet University, George Mason, George Washington, Georgetown, Howard University, Marymount University, Mt. Vernon College Trinity College, the University of the District of Columbia, and the University of Maryland, College Park. Up to nine (9) credits from courses taken at other institutions may be applied towards the MCP degree. Before registering for any non-UMD courses, students should confirm that the courses (a) will be accepted by Registrar’s Office at the University of Maryland, and (b) will be accepted by the URSP and will apply toward the degree requirements.
