The University of Maryland College Park team advances to the final four in the 2024 ULI Hines Student Urban Design Competition with its entry, "The Cascades," a \$1.76 Billion, forward-thinking metropolitan revitalization project that revolutionizes an existing community in Downtown Seattle from business-oriented to people-focused, while addressing critical issues of equity through connectivity, sustainability and socioeconomic growth.

This neighborhood redesign envisions vibrancy and usability for a greener, more accessible and more active community with the underserved population at its core. This mixed-use neighborhood facilitates an accessible and exciting downtown experience with six housing structures, retail and restaurants.

Professors Tanya Bansal and John Park met up with a few of our alumni, including Robby Bessette MRED '23 and Andrea De Carlo ARDV '19.

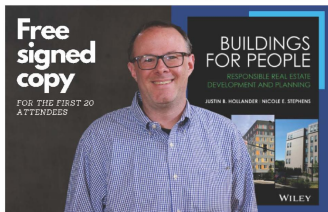

Justin B. Hollander is a professor of Urban and Environmental Policy and Planning at Tufts University. His research and teaching are in the areas of physical planning, real estate development, technology, shrinking cities, and the intersection between cognitive science and the design of cities. He co-edited the book *Urban Experience and Design: Contemporary Perspectives on Improving the Public Realm* (Routledge, 2020) and is the author of ten other books on urban planning and design, including *Cognitive Architecture: Designing for How We Respond to the Built Environment* (with Ann Sussman) and *Urban Social Learning: Potential and Pitfalls for Using Microblogging Data in Studying Cities*. He was recently inducted as a Fellow of the American Institute of Certified Planners and hosts the Apple podcast “Cognitive Urbanism.”
